GENERAL

- Our priority was to resolve the ongoing noise problems with East Ayrshire Council. We can
 report that the council thanked us for our pro active approach to resolving the situation and
 stated that in their opinion if we adhere to our own policy it should provide a reasonable
 level of control.
- Following flooding during October 2012 significant upgrades and essential maintenance were carried out to the Kames drainage system. This was costly, but hopefully this will help avoid problems in what are becoming more regular downpours.
- 2013 was the clubs 50th anniversary and several events were organised to mark the occasion. The first was the dinner held in the Dumfries Arms Hotel, which was the venue of the club's first meeting. This was held in conjunction with the launch of the 2nd club book. The second was the open weekend held at Kames and the last was the Arran weekend.
- Our first tween drivers' event took place in December. This gives the opportunity for 12 and 13 year old drivers to drive standard road cars at low speeds around the paddock and onto the track.

FINANCES

• This year we have made a small loss, although turnover was similar to the previous year.

• The increase in expense can be attributed to significant non recurring expenses (e.g. Kames drains) and catching up on backlog of maintenance at the track.

MEMBERSHIP

- Once again quite a strong membership of 373 at the end of the year, up from 361 in 2012.
- Our online membership system is now up and running.

RALLIES

- As well as a successful junior rally training day where our own instructors (Melvyn and Ian) gave the youngsters some valuable tips and advice on cornering, braking etc we ran 3 successful rallies in 2013. Junior drivers have been paramount to the events running at Kames. It would be nice to see an increase, not a decrease in the senior entries though it maybe the seniors are getting embarrassed with the times the juniors are putting in.
- A lot of our club members were involved in the 40th running of the Galloway Hills Rally which was also a round in the Scottish Rally Championship. 66 cars started and it seemed to go well. Unfortunately it has not been included in this years SRC..

SPRINTS

- We organised 4 national B sprint events during the year and although numbers were down 28% on 2012, enthusiasm was still high and several track records were beaten.
- As part of our golden jubilee celebrations we held a team challenge during our July weekend. After some fierce competition Caithness Car Club team A drove north with the winners trophy and EACC team A were a close second.

Auto Test & Grass Tests

- Two autotests were held early in 2013, with both rounds counting towards the joint winter challenge co promoted with Scottish Sporting Car Club.
- 5 grass tests were held during the year and were well attended. Both young members and new older members attended. Thanks to the members who helped down at Pinwherry.
