There was a poor turnout for the Saturday session of the Sprint Test Day at Kames on March 12/13th due to inclement weather. However a number of entrants from elsewhere were snowed in and failed to make an appearance. Sunday was a relatively fine day and after a slow start, numbers increased considerably by lunchtime. There was quite a lot of action, most of which we will not go into, but there were two new singleseaters both very attractive indeed and we look forward to seeing them in action next month. Allan McDonald was there both days sorting out teething troubles with his new machine, Mini-based of course but with a 1300cc Suzuki turbocharged engine and four wheel drive.

We understand the Machars Car Club sprint at kames on May 22nd is to be a round of the Midland Speed Championship and we hear from Robin Christie around twenty drivers have shown interest in travelling up the M6.

## A HISTORY OF EAST AYRSHIRE CAR CLUB and KAMES MOTORSPORT COMPLEX 1963-1989

We are pleased to inform members the above book is at the printers as we write. It will have 228 pages and will contain around 400 photographs, approximately half of which will be in colour. The EACC Committee have opted for a quality finish with 130gsm Gloss Art paper being used and a hard cloth cover with a sleeve designed by David Shaw. The Foreword is by Sir Tom Hunter. The price has yet to be fixed but it could be in the £19/£20 region, which represents good value for a book of this size.
